What CREARTE project is about?

CREARTE (Creative Primary School Partnerships with Visual Artists) is a project that draws upon the priority areas of the education and training process offering an alternative literacy and a creative space for children of the age of 6-12 to be engaged in experiential and cooperative learning by working with contemporary visual artists.

CREARTE's focus:


- to exchange opinions and share ideas and expertise between the partners about the collaboration between schools and visual artists



Project Funding

- 16 creative school partnerships with 19 visual artists were funded
- payment of the services of one or more visual artists for each project, depending on the form of cooperation
- payment of necessary materials for the implementation of projects





The projects were built according to the needs of the school/teachers, the students and the artists.

Teachers and schools collaborated with visual artists for the purposes of organization, planning and implementing the projects.







The projects

- engaged children with the Cyprus visual artists
- developed critical thinking, creativity and artistic expression of children
- dealt with topics or ideas related to various areas of the Curriculum
- collaborated with the community, linking the socio-cultural and educational backgrounds of the participants.





Pedagogical Advocacy

CREARTE suggests child-centred pedagogies that focus on experiential learning and explorative approaches and emphasizes:

- the exploitation of the interests and experiences of students in real-authentic situations.
- the multimodal expression and creation
- the in-depth exploration of materials and ideas
- the acceptance of subjectivity; multiple interpretations and diverse ways of learning
- the enhancement of critical thinking and research





Pedagogical Advocacy

CREARTE

- encourages diversity and flexibility in designing and delivering the visual arts projects.
- gives emphasis to the utilization of various teaching strategies such as play, dialogue, investigation of materials and ideas, experimentation, visual research, debate, interaction with authentic situations/ artefacts/ people, reflection and dissemination of ideas.





Criteria of planning CREARTE projects

- Presented the stages of organisation and application of creative collaboration
- Determined with clarity realistic objectives and suitable activities.
- Developed the energetic methods of learning (e.g. active entanglement of students in the decision-making, cooperative learning, critical investigation and problem solving).





Criteria of planning CREARTE projects

- Planned according to the methodology and content of Cyprus Visual Arts Curriculum.
- The content of the project was related to the artists' field of study.





Criteria of planning CREARTE projects

- Presented the process of evaluation, which included documentation of the work in process, as well as the final work/event/report/performance
- Characterized by originality, creativity and artistic value.





Educational recourses are produced to

- a) enhance students' collaboration with professionals
- b) connect school life with the real world of creative professionals that could serve as role models and inspire young students
- c) promote networking of schools with the creative community as well as collaborative approaches to teaching through visual arts





Educational recourses are produced to

- d) engage students from all backgrounds and with various abilities to collaborative research work with creative professionals as well as their fellow students
- e) provide alternative and creative spaces in the school programmes so as to make teaching and learning more attractive and efficient, and achieve the development of basic and transversal skills.





Educational recourses are produced to

- f) disseminate the results through:
- the official CREARTE open source online platform (www.crearte.up.pt),
- the official Ministry of Education and Culture website and
- the edition of the Department of Primary Education and Cyprus Pedagogical Institute.





Feedback
